Precinct Captains help share **accurate election information** within their community.

Responsibilities:

- ✓ Share official election information
- ✓ Distribute informational flyers
- ✓ Coordinate volunteers
- ✓ Attend community meetings
- ✓ Direct residents to official election resources

Key Information Precinct Captains Should Know

Primary Election Date: **January 9, 2026**

Poll Hours: 7AM-7PM

Early Voting: May 26-June 4

8:30AM-5PM

No Saturdays or Sundays

Residents should be able to find:

- Polling locations
- Voter registration status
- Early voting information
- Election deadlines

Weekly Tasks for Precinct Captains

4 Weeks Before Election

- Identify community locations for flyer distribution
- Recruit volunteers
- Share election information with neighborhood groups

3 Weeks Before

- Post informational flyers
- Share election date reminders
- Coordinate volunteer outreach

2 Weeks Before

- Attend community meetings
- Distribute additional materials
- Remind residents to verify polling locations

Final Week

- Share reminders about poll hours
- Direct residents to official voter information
- Provide last-minute election updates from official sources
